PRESENTATION

THE 4TH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON CURRICULUM POLICIES AND PRACTICES will be held from November 10 to 13, 2009 in the city of João Pessoa, Paraíba, Brazil as an initiative of the Postgraduate Programs in Education of the Universidade Federal da Paraíba (UFPB) and Universidade do Estado do Rio de Janeiro (UERJ) through the Study and Research Group on Curriculum Policies and Practices and the Curriculum Research Group: Subjects, Knowledge and Culture. With the topic **‘DIFFERENCE IN CURRICULUM POLICIES’**, the event proposes that difference should be analyzed as a possibility to reinterpret the meaning of the multiple discourses in investigations on curriculum beyond cultural pluralism and liberal tolerance. This means recognizing that difference may be translated and re-inscribed differently when similarities and differences oppose the schism of fixed binarisms and explore other possibilities for the construction of hegemonies considering the multiple and different contingent particularities of the subjects’ new positions in contemporary societies (gender, race, sexuality, social class, religion, culture, minority powers or regional differences).

**TECHNICAL NORMS:
SUBMISSION OF PAPERS**

The following conditions apply for the submission of papers and posters:

- Two submissions are allowed (paper or poster) – one under the condition of author and the other (if applicable) obligatorily under the condition of co-author.

- Submissions must be made exclusively through the AEPPPC website, complying with the entire submission process. Submissions made through any other means (e-mail, post, personal presentation, etc.) will not be considered.
- The text must be not previously published in Brazil by the time of its presentation at the 5th International Conference on Curriculum Policies and Practices.
- No inclusion and/or exclusion of author/co-author or substitution or change in the files (paper/poster) submitted for evaluation will be permitted. Thus, it is recommended that authors double-check their files prior to submission.
- Upon submitting a paper/poster for evaluation, authors and co-authors will be granting literary property and all authorial rights of the paper to the 5th International Conference on Curriculum Policies and Practices in all versions in Portuguese and other languages in printed and electronic (CD and Internet) forms.
- The data contained on the submission form are entirely the responsibility of the authors.
- Accepted submissions (paper/poster – abstract and complete text) will be published exclusively in Electronic Annals (CD-ROM).
- Submissions (paper/poster) that, for any reason, fail to comply either partially or wholly with any of these conditions will be excluded by the Secretary or Scientific Committee.

1. INTERACTIVE ORAL COMMUNICATION

- Interactive oral communication will be considered essays, studies and research results addressing new topics or those already established in the field of Education that demonstrate theoretical elaboration and conceptual rigor in the analysis.
- Only papers from teachers, researchers, Master's students and doctoral students will be accepted for Interactive Oral Communication. Work from undergraduates and scientific initiation students will only be accepted in the Poster session.
- Papers for the Interactive Oral Communication session must be in article format, with the objectives declared and developed, conclusions and bibliographic references, structured with a minimum of 20,000 characters and a maximum of 40,000 characters, including references and appendices.
- The abstract of the Interactive Oral Communication must have a maximum of 1500 characters, including spaces, title, text of the abstract and keywords.

- It is recommended that the formatting of the files (abstract and complete text) comply with the norms of the ABNT (Brazilian Association of Technical Norms).
- References should be located at the end of the text, exclusively containing the papers cited.
- Frames, tables, graph, figures (photographs or drawings) must come after the references, with an indication of the font (when applicable).

1.1 Formatting on Interactive oral communications

- File format: ".doc" or ".rtf";
- Font: Times New Roman, size 12;
- Paper size: A4;
- Upper and lower margin of 2.5 cm;
- Left and right margin of 3 cm;
- Spacing between lines: 1.5 cm;
- Alignment: Justified;
- Name of files with the paper (abstract and complete text) to be attached to the submission should contain complete name of author/co-author, preceded by the word: Abstract and/or Complete Text.

- Title in uppercase letters/bold type, centered alignment.

2. POSTER

- Work from undergraduates and scientific initiation students (PIBIC, PROLICEN, etc.) will be accepted in the Poster session.
- In the case of submission of work for presentation in the Poster session, scientific initiation students must fulfill the condition of co-author, together with the adviser.
- For the submission of a poster, it is necessary to attach three files: 1) abstract, 2) complete text and 3) flowchart.
- The flowchart of the poster must include elements that will be presented graphically.
- The objective of the poster is to present the results of studies initiated, work carried out and experiences or communications. A poster must have between 10,000 and 12,000

characters, including spaces, notes, references, frames or tables, if applicable. The graphic flowchart of the poster should be presented on a sheet of A4 paper;

- The abstract of the poster must contain a maximum of 1500 characters, including spaces, title, text of the abstract and keywords.
- The graphic presentation of selected posters must contain the following items: title, name(s) of the presenter(s) and institution(s), introduction, problem/issues, objectives, methodology, results and/or conclusions. The dimensions proposed are 1.20 m in height by 80 cm in width;
- During the presentation, the distribution of folders or pamphlets with summarized information on the work and forms of contacting the author(s) is recommended;
- It is recommended that the formatting of the files (abstract, complete text and flowchart) comply with the norms of the ABNT (Brazilian Association of Technical Norms).
- References should be located at the end of the text, exclusively containing the papers cited.
- Frames, tables, graph, figures (photographs or drawings) must come after the references, with an indication of the font (when applicable).

- Font: Times New Roman, size 12;
- Paper size: A4;
- Upper and lower margin of 2.5 cm;
- Left and right margin of 3 cm;
- Spacing between lines: 1.5 cm;
- Alignment: Justified;
- Name of files with the paper (abstract and complete text) to be attached to the submission should contain complete name of author/co-author, preceded by the word: Abstract and/or Complete Text.
